

AN INTERVIEW WITH MS. JANSEN: RENAMING MEMORIAL

1. How does the process work?

A Memorial alum named Mya Berry put forth a formal proposal to the school board. In the proposal, she asks for the school to be renamed because of James Madison's connection to slavery, and how students of color don't feel welcomed in the space. She proceeded to make a suggestion for Vel Phillips, and the school board nominated members to the committee to take proposals for names and send final options to the school board.

2. How were names chosen/eliminated?

It was a really long process: names were proposed by the public and each name put forward was put through a rubric. This rubric was the district's requirements for a new name and was used to score each name out of 5. It included things like, are they a local figure or a national figure, are they connected to MMSD, etc. After this, duplicates were removed, names that weren't serious were removed, and this brought the list down to 21 or 22 names. As a committee, we decided that the names with a score of 3 and up would be considered further. This brought it down to about 12 names. Following this, committee members each did a ranked selection of names, and eventually, the total was down to 4 names.

3. What do you feel is the most important part of the renaming process?

For me, all decisions were guided by two main things. First, when I heard about the renaming proposal, I wanted to make sure we kept the "Memorial" part. People identify with it and practically speaking, there are going to be major financial issues if we have to worry about rebranding everything. After talking to different coaches around the school, I found that if we have to replace uniforms and cover athletic needs it would be around \$700,000.

I proposed this to the school board as a requirement for whatever name we decide to change to, and it was accepted in September. The second thing that I find really important is remaining true to the original sentiment of what Mya Berry said: the process was started to help students of color feel seen and cared for, so the name we choose should represent that sentiment.

4. How is public opinion factored into the decision?

From the beginning, the school board has made notifications to the Madison community about the process, the committee has considered public comments on the school board website, and my comments on the process were on the Cap Times which gave some scope on the overall issue. We kept asking ourselves, did we do things the best way to get all voices involved? Announcements were made, emails were sent to families, and the final piece was the public hearing where individuals could come speak at the meeting or submit comments.

5. What is your role in the renaming process?

The chair was there to help facilitate, everyone else was there as community members to help make the decision and to make sure we were hearing from different voices.

6. Why do you feel it is important to rename the school?

I hope the most important thing to anyone who works here is that we've created a space where every student that wants to be here feels welcome: if this helps with that, I'm all for it.

7. Any more information you'd like to share about the process?

Students who have comments should direct them to the school board now because we sent our final choices of Vel Phillips in, and now it is the school board's decision.

TIANGONG: CHINA'S FIRST STEP TOWARD A NEW SPACE RACE

On July 17, Chinese astronauts boarded, for the first time, China's new Tiangong space station in orbit, representing a momentous step forward in the nation's aspirations for being a larger player in the growing space economy. This is by no means China's first attempt at a space station, with two previous stations, named Tiangong-1 and Tiangong-2 being successful trial runs of the current station, officially called Tiangong-3. Both stations re-entered Earth's atmosphere after manned and unmanned missions to them for testing, returning respectively in April of 2018 with an uncontrolled descent, and a controlled one in July 2019.

With years of planning starting in the few years before the turn of the century, China has big plans for space exploration using Tiangong. The primary purpose of the space station will be to provide a space for China and other selected nations to provide training opportunities for astronauts, as well as scientific facilities, as China was blocked from accessing the ISS by NASA in 2011. Recently announcing plans with Russia for an International Lunar Research Station, China hopes to begin a series of rover and orbiter rockets to prepare for this proposed 2030 base of operations on the moon. These massive developments promise success and discoveries for many countries, although some, such as Bill Nelson, the NASA administrator for President Biden, view it as a threat. In presenting China as a spacefaring competitor, NASA hopes to gain the financial resources it needs in order to initiate further missions in space. Tiangong represents a jumping off point for China's cosmic projects, and provides excellent incentives for other nations to propel themselves into the future.

LEBANON IN CRISIS

On June 1, 2021, the World Bank announced that the financial and economic crisis happening in Lebanon was" in the top three, most severe crises episodes globally since the mid-nineteenth century." Lebanon's currency has lost over 90% of its value in the last two years and Lebanon has the highest inflation rate in the world at 144.10% (the U.S. is at 6.2%). The U.N. says that three quarters of the people are living below the poverty line. Food prices and fuel shortages are hurting the people most.

On Oct 10th, Lebanon's two main power plants were forced to shut down due to lack of fuel leaving many people with no electricity for 24 hours. Most people wait up to 8 hours in a line to get gasoline. Lines for bread can also be long; many bakeries have closed because there is no fuel to turn the ovens on or the cost of fuel is more than the owner can spend. Meat and fruit are so expensive they are considered luxuries. Hospitals turn off lights and air conditioning to save fuel for operating rooms. Hospitals face staff shortages because fuel shortages make it impossible for staff to get to work. Lebanon was once a leading place for medical care for the Arab world, now it tells "patients to bring their own drugs and turn others away due to lack of supplies, equipment."

But the biggest problem is percieved government inaction. Most people believe the government to be corrupt. Back in October of 2019, thousands staged protests calling for the government to resign. Even the World Bank said: "responses by Lebanon's leadership to these challenges have been highly inadequate.. due to a ... bankrupt economic system, which benefited a few for so long." The government has not met for the last two months.

DAVE CHAPPELLE UNDER FIRE FOR ANTI-TRANS JOKES

After his comedy special, The Closer, was released on Netflix, Dave Chappelle has been under fire for making several transphobic comments. The last of the series of six specials included jokes that implied that "gender is a fact" and compared homophobic comments with racism, ignoring the challenges that many BIPOC trans people face.

Many Netflix employees have spoken out, requesting it be taken down. Jacklyn Moore, an executive producer for the Netflix series "Dear White People" who is also a trans employee, tweeted she would not work with Netflix again "as long as they continue to put out and profit from blatantly and dangerously transphobic content." Netflix also fired a staff member for leaking "commercially sensitive information" about the special to a news source. The confidential data hoped to point

out the fact that Netflix paid more for controversial content rather than better-performing content.

Netflix's co-chief executive Ted Sarandos has held his position to keep Chappelle's special, arguing, "Distinguishing between commentary and harm is hard, especially with stand-up comedy which exists to push boundaries. Some people find the art of stand-up to be mean-spirited, but our members enjoy it, and it's an important part of our content offering."

In response to Sarandos's comments, trans employees and supporters at Netflix organized a walkout for October 20th. Ashlee Marie Preston, the organizer of the event, stated, "There is this manipulation of algorithmic science that distorts the way that we perceive ourselves and others. And I think that companies like Netflix, Facebook, and Instagram, they play into it, and they monetize on it. I think that this is important to show up today."

Amidst the backlash, Dave Chappelle has decided to screen the documentary himself, touring at ten different cities throughout November.

NEW TOOLS TO SKIP LONG WAIT TIMES COME TO WALT DISNEY WORLD

When you think of the word genie, what comes to your mind first? Magic? Well, the Walt Disney Company has found a new meaning for "genie" within their theme parks with the introduction of the Genie+system at Walt Disney World. Genie+ and Lightning Lanes are two of Disney's newest tools to try and improve guest experience in the park. Introduced in late August, the two work together to replace Fastpass+ and attempt to minimize the time that guests have to spend waiting in lines for their favorite attractions.

Lightning Lane is very similar to the old Fastpass+ system. It gives guests the ability to wait in shorter lines for their favorite attractions. One of the main differences is that guests cannot make their selections ahead of time. Lightning Lane selections must be made the morning of the visit and guests must pay individually for each attraction that they would like to

bypass the line for. Each ride has a different price ranging from \$7 to \$15 per person per reservation. Each rider will need to purchase their own pass, and up to two different Lightning Lane passes can be purchased.

Genie+ also serves to provide less waiting for guests, but is formatted in a different way. Genie+ is \$16 per person per day, and it gives guests the ability to choose different open Lightning Lane times throughout the day. Guests can choose as many times as become available, and can choose new times all day without any additional cost.

Although both of these new devices were designed to improve guest experience, they haven't been met with all positive feedback. Many diehard Disney fans are upset at the company's cash grab attempt that they say is making the Disney dream vacation even less attainable for lower income families. The jury may be out on the immediate impacts of Genie+ and Lightning Lane at Walt Disney World, but only time will tell how these new systems really impact the beloved theme park.

ARE EPIC'S DIVERSITY INITIATIVES ONLY SKIN DEEP?

A recent leak of a recording of Epic Systems president Carl Dvorak reveals a less-than-positive attitude towards activism and inclusion within the company. The company continues to improve and develop progressive measures, but employee complaints and company actions cast a shadow over new training programs.

In the leak, Dvorak said "There's just a moment where you have to say work is work. Personal life is personal life. You ought to say no to a whole bunch of stuff that's happening right now because some of its good and interesting and appropriate for your personal endeavors. It's not part of our endeavor here."

Since the source of the recording is unknown and no context is provided, the meaning is questionable. Epic released a statement that the conversation in the recording took place in the summer of 2020, as part of a company meeting concerning diversity.

The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel reported that Dvorak sent an email to workgroups for employees of color telling them not to participate in "virtual walkouts" as part of Black Lives Matter demonstrations. "We are on your side opposing racism and brutality... keep in mind we are a good company," Dvorak wrote. This statement seems to contradict itself, discouraging efforts to foster change while asking to be viewed as a "good company."

According to the Wisconsin State Journal, multiple employees at Epic stated that they worked to make Epic's software and culture more inclusive and accessible—initiatives that went unsupported by the company. Employees have also complained that Epic cut company training programs related to diversity, equity, and inclusion; Epic did not replace these groups immediately.

As of fall of 2021, Epic hosts a number of diversity initiatives and training programs for its employees. Some of these are mandatory, and many others have long wait-lists. These efforts, while not an all-encompassing balm, are a step in the right direction when it comes to addressing workplace racism. One can only hope that Epic Systems actually follows through on its pledge to create a diverse and equitable workspace.

AMC ADDS OPEN CAPTIONS TO 240 US MOVIE THEATRE LOCATIONS

As of late October 2021, AMC announced that it would be adding open captions to select screenings at 240 US locations in an effort to make going to the movies more accessible. Open captions, similar to subtitles, are onscreen captions that narrate dialogue/music. For people with hearing disabilities, people who are learning English, people with ADHD, etc. open captions make movie-going possible and fun. Although AMC had previously offered closed caption services (individual electronic devices that narrated films), they were inconvenient and often broken. Reviews of the new service have been overwhelmingly positive, and AMC hopes that this change is a step forward in making their programming more inclusive.

VACCINE CLINICS

As the Pfizer vaccine has been approved for ages 5 and up, vaccine clinics are being established by MMSD. With the increase in cases, this has become a greater priority. In a partnership with SSM Health, there will be many vaccine clinics created: Stephens Elementary, Leopold Elementary, Thoreau Elementary West High School, Capital High School, Memorial High School & Jefferson Middle School, LaFollette High School & Sennett Middle School, Stephens Elementary School.

The creation of these vaccine clinics has been a result of cases increasing. Although 75% of Dane County has been vaccinated, cases are on the rise, and ages 8-11 are one of the groups with the highest cases. As a result, MMSD has been looking into areas where vaccines are not as readily available to set up vaccine clinics.

To get a vaccine, parents can schedule an appointment or sign a written consent form.

MMSD GUEST WI-FI SHUTDOWN

RITTENHOUSE RULING: NOT GUILTY

After a contentious ruling by Judge Bruce Schroeder, Kyle Rittenhouse has been acquitted of all charges. The main charges carried into court were first-degree reckless homicide, two counts of first-degree recklessly endangering society, and first-degree intentional homicide.

In August of 2020, Kenosha, WI, was dealing with the aftermath of the Jacob Blake shooting. As people took to the streets to protest, two men were shot by 17-year-old Kyle Rittenhouse. A supporter of law enforcement, Kyle Rittenhouse took a semi-automatic rifle to the protests in Kenosha to "protect property" as protests grew violent. He claims that, "part of my job also is to protect people. If someone is hurt, I'm running into harm's way." Caught on video throughout the night, Rittenhouse is seen patrolling the streets with his rifle in hand. Later, a man pursues him and as Rittenhouse turns to see the commotion, he shoots a man. This man was later identified as Joseph Rosenbaum, who had just been discharged from a hospital in a sentiment of unrest, and allegedly gave chase to Rittenhouse unarmed. Feeling threatened by the man, Rittenhouse shot at him four times and killed him. He proceeded to shoot two more people, claiming self-defense. All of whom he claimed attacked him in some way or another.

SQUID GAME'S INFLUENCE ON LABOR PROTESTS

In late October 2021, thousands of workers in South Korea marched in demand of better employment protections and higher wages. The protests capitalized on the success of the hit Netflix show, "Squid Game", which portrays poverty-stricken workers as they compete for an enormous cash prize in children's games, all at the expense of their lives. Many wore costumes reminiscent of the show's characters, and the organizers of the rally, the Korean Confederation of Trade Unions (KCTU), even helped produce a promotional Squid Game inspired video calling on the government and labor unions to defend workers.

Squid Game, which came out earlier this fall, is a Korean drama series that satirizes the way in which a capitalist economy pushes those of the lowest socio-economic classes to desperate measures, while the rich profit off of worker exploitation, and has since helped increase the media coverage of protests such as this one. The show was heavily inspired by economic conditions in South Korea following the 2008 economic depression, which caused the lay-off of thousands of employees.

The effects of the Covid-19 pandemic on the Korean economy mirror those of 2008. While South Korea has maintained a relatively low number of Covid cases, its economy has been hard hit. In particular, the labor sector has seen the lowest employment rates in eight years. As a result, the KTCU has called for the right for all workers to form unions, greater job security protections; and for the strengthening of public transportation, medical care, housing, and education.

While South Korean workers are continuing to call for greater government action, Korean President Moon Jae-in has expressed his disregard for the protests, calling them "disappointing" in the wake of new



DUNE REVIEW: STUNNING VISUALS & STORYTELLING

Since its original release in 1965, fans have been eagerly anticipating a film adaptation of the hit novel Dune, written by Frank Herbert. After many attempts at rendering the enormous novel into a movie with a comparable sense of grandiosity, it seems that the mark has finally been struck with Dennis Villeneuve's take on the book.

As always, Dennis Villeneuve hits a perfect balance of stunning visuals and well-written dialogue with the story of Dune, a desert planet with a precious spice called the melange, which allows for space travel and grants supernatural abilities to those who consume it. The film sees the Atreides family arrive to Dune (or as it is usually called, Arrakis) to serve as the leaders of the planet. Paul, the son of Duke Leto Atreides, begins to have visions of his future on Arrakis, subsequently considering his place on this world and whether he is truly capable of achieving what many think he can become.

The cinematic quality of Dune is something that truly can not be ignored. No expense was spared in assuring that nothing looked cheap or half-done. Though there is a definite use of computer-generated imagery, it rarely feels over the top. The effects are able to enhance the story, but they never overshadow other aspects of the film in their efforts. The score is also magnificent, accentuating many of the scenes without overtaking the moments on screen.

Villeneuve's writing remains in top shape as he brings life into a vast array of characters, both villainous and friendly without ever stumbling over the unwieldy length of the book or the enormity of its scope.

Due to its immense critical success, a sequel has already been announced for 2023. It is expected to cover the rest of the first volume of the Dune series from Frank Herbert, and some expect other sequels and spin-offs if Dune 2 performs well at the box office. For many fans, Dune's time at the cinema has just started and it will hopefully grow into another behemoth of a franchise the likes of which have rarely been seen.

GHOSTBUSTERS: AFTERLIFE TRAILER REVIEW

Ghostbusters: Afterlife follows Callie (Carrie Coon of The Leftovers) and her children Trevor (Finn Wolfhard of Stranger Things) and Phoebe (Mckenna Grace) as they leave their city life behind and move to a dilapidated farmhouse in the middle of nowhere that Callie's father owned and died in. It turns out that her father was also Egon Spengler, the former ghost hunter originally played by Harold Ramis. The film as

a whole is a touching tribute to Ramis, the co-writer and co-star of the original films, who died in 2014. Inside the house, Egon left hundreds of ghost hunting tools, gadgets and props for Phoebe and Trevor to discover and for longtime fans to cheer for. These moments of nostalgia



are scattered throughout, and the references are mostly innocuous, although the camera sometimes seems to linger too long on a prop or two from the original film. The only real exception is a stifling moment near the end of the film that sends it skidding toward the nostalgia cliff and spoils the experience a bit.

Unlike other recent sequels that have been delayed, Afterlife avoids the worst pitfalls of nostalgia by making the children its main characters. Trevor and Phoebe don't idolize the Ghostbusters - they've barely heard of them, leaving the excitement to the fans in the room, rather than forcing it on the actors on screen.

Perhaps the most commendable part of Afterlife is its structure, and how little it resembles the original Ghostbusters, even though the films' stories share more than a few similarities. There is no attempt to form a new team of ghostbusters, or to recapture the magic and chemistry of the original stars. Instead, Reitman focuses on building strong characters - something he excelled at in his previous films, like Up in

the Air and Juno - and bringing them into the world of Ghostbusters. Rather than a work of pure reinvention, Afterlife feels more like an expansion of the universe and boundaries that define what a Ghostbusters film can be.

Even with its focus on its new young

characters, Ghostbusters: Afterlife is still packed with references, inside jokes, and respect for the original films in the series. There are dozens of little moments that will have die-hard Ghostbusters fans cheering. Ghostbusters: Afterlife hits theaters on November 19th, make sure to check it out.


Shovel Racing

FIGURE SKATING UPDATE

With the 2022 Winter Olympics approaching, figure skaters are proving their technical and artistic skills in back-to-back competitions. First, let's take a look at Skate America and Skate Canada, the first two of six Grand Prix events before the Olympics. Perhaps the most surprising turn of events was Nathan Chen placing third at Skate America. Chen opened his short program with a fall on the quad lutz and, although well-concealed, missed the triple toe of a combination jump, placing him in 4th after the 1st round. In his long program, Chen attempted six quads, opening with a beautiful quad loop, but popped multiple jumps. Chen placed 3rd overall, behind Vincent Zhou (1st place) and Shoma Uno (2nd place).

Vincent Zhou skated away with a well-deserved gold medal for a phenomenal overall performance. His short program opened with a well-executed quad lutz-triple toe combo and boasted several other quads, placing him in 1st after the 1st round. His long program was no different, featuring a virtually flawless performance, giving Zhou an overall score of 295.56.

The Russian figure skater Alexandra Trusova, also known as the "Quad Queen," dominated the ladies' event at Skate America, opening her short program with a breathtaking quad lutz. But due to a foot injury, Trusova changed her free skate to "only one quad." Even with a lower technical score than she's used to, Trusova skated away with the gold medal. At Skate Canada, Chen gave his ultimate redemption performance. Chen scored over 100 points on his short program, landing each of his quads with a positive GOE (Grade of Execution). His long program, featuring four quads, a triple axel, and a footwork sequence that interacts so well with the music, put Chen with an astonishing 307.18 points and a gold-medal win.

The Russian figure skaters dominated the podium again at Skate Canada, this time with Kamila Valieva breaking the record for the highest score in women's singles figure skating. With a free skate boasting three quads, a triple axel, plus artistic skills throughout, Valieva received a well-deserved score of 265.08. Valieva, along with her teammates Alexandra Trusova and Daria Usacheva, will be exciting to watch in the upcoming Grand Prix events.

Never let others use your debit or credit card. That's like handing them all the money in your account.



Never cash a check for someone else. This is a really common scam — if someone asks you to cash a check, it's likely bad, but you won't know that right away. The thief will walk away with cash and you'll be responsible for paying back the amount of the check.

One last thing to think about: If something sounds too good to be true, it probably is.

Don't be tempted by fast cash, the promise you "won't get caught" or someone asking for a "favor." If you let someone use your account information to write a bad check or make fake purchases, you're the one who will have to pay the money back. And that could be very expensive.
